

Social Emotional Learning

In Second Step, first graders discussed how listening and following directions are important skills for learning. Repeating directions helps you remember them. Following directions involves using your eyes, ears, and brain.

Reading



Social Studies

This week we learned about the Jewish holiday Yom Kippur, celebrated on Wednesday. This day is about thinking about our mistakes, saying sorry to someone if you have made



them upset, and praying. Traditionally, people who celebrate Yom Kippur do not work or eat from the evening before Yom Kippur until sunset on Yom Kippur. When people do not eat during this time period, it is called a fast. Many people wear all white. Yom Kippur ends with a single blast that is blown on the *shofar*—a trumpet made from a ram's horn. Then people have a feast-usually of breakfast foods-often with music and dancing.

Fundations



This week we continued work in Unit 1, which is a three week unit reviewing letter sounds and lowercase letter formation. This week we

focused on the letters a, g, d, s, e, r, j, p, and j. We also worked on echoing, practicing letter key words and sounds, reviewing the lines and sky writing, and finally the proper pencil grip and posture for writing.

Math

This week in math students began working with **data**. We sorted objects into different



categories and made representations to show how we sorted and how many are in each **category**. We discussed the different ways to represent data using words, pictures, numbers and tally marks. We continued math centers from last week and learned a new game called *What's Behind My Back*. Partners worked together to find the missing addend to make 10 and recorded the equation. We also looked closely at surveys and discussed what we can learn about the data from the representation.
